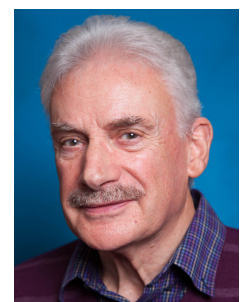
From the President

Production Co-ordinator's Column

Our production of “**Ruddigore**”, by Gilbert and Sullivan, was a great success, achieving 84% seat occupancy. Congratulations to Brian, Mary and their cast and crew. Due to a budget overspend on this production, new guidelines have been drawn up for directors.

The Phoenix Youth Theatre Showcase in March was excellent. What young talent we have in our theatre. Congratulations to Sarah and the PYT.

Keith James’ show, “**Solid Air**”, the music of John Martin and Nick Drake, played to a full house. Keith will be returning to the Phoenix Theatre on 22nd October with “**Duende**”, and on 17th December with “**The Songs of Leonard Cohen**”.

Our entry in the **2017 Herefordshire One Act Drama Festival** was “**Can Malone Die?**” written and directed by **David Pollard**. We achieved three awards, winning the **Wye Cup** for coming third in the festival, the **Andrew’s Shield** for Best Original Play, and the **Oswin Cup** for Best Novice. Congratulations to David, his cast and crew.

We were nominated for the 2016 Best Drama Award in NODA District One for our production of “Anastasia”. NODA is the National Operatic and Dramatic Association of which we are members. The awards ceremony was in Stourbridge on Sunday 23rd April. Brian and Judy Jackson, Michelle Cooper and Sam Callen attended. There were three nominations in our section and **WE WON!** We received a certificate for being nominated and a certificate for winning. The certificates will go on show in the foyer. Congratulations to all involved in this exceptional production.

Our next production will be “**All Things Considered**” by **Ben Brown**, directed by **Renée Field** and assisted by **Tom Lee-Hynes**. Production dates are **Saturday 24th June to Saturday 1st July**. The cast comprise Robin Haig, Phil Field, Gareth Wigg, Howard Owen, Michelle Cooper, Lucy Davies and new member, Lizzie Nicholson. NODA Review of Ruddigore

For such a small theatre (64 seats in total) this was a gigantic success. The comical antics of Director, Brian Jackson, during the overture was a really nice touch. As much as I love G&S overtures, for those not so accustomed can find them a little on the long side and so to have Brian coming and going throughout was very clever. As too was situating the accompanist and prompt on stage throughout, sitting in their own little booth which was very much in keeping with the set. It was amazing how quickly you forgot that they were there as the cast kept the audience captivated throughout. The brilliant use of the space available was amazing and never looked cramped. I particularly liked the costumes that looked so authentic, but were quite simple in design.

Ruddigore has some of the nicest music and is one of the funniest G&S operettas; and the cast certainly did it justice. The strength and purity of sound from the ladies chorus in their opening number set the tone for the evening. Their timing was great too, especially every time they burst into 'Hail the Bridesmaid, Hail the Bride' which was very funny.

Every one of the principal characters had lovely singing voices, which sadly is not always the case. Michelle Cooper playing Rose really understood her character and brought just the right amount of humour to the role especially when referring to her book of etiquette, not to mention her fickleness when choosing a suitable husband. Michelle has a good strong voice with a comfortable range. Andrew Doyle reminded me very much of the modern adaptations of G&S that were recorded in the 1970's, when the principals took a more relaxed approach; but I really liked his style. Andrew and Michelle's duet was truly touching. Richard Dauntless played by Gareth Wigg, is the likeable ladies' man in the show and Gareth did this really well. He is a definitive tenor with a nice tone and can reach the high notes with ease. He also can do a mean horn pipe. Roger Williams was the roguish Baronet who gave a good impression of this character and also has a lovely voice. Jane Bovell had a semi comedy role in the shape of Dame Hannah and would be a great poker player as she kept a perfect straight face. Her duet with Nigel Hughes as Sir Roderick, 'The Great Oak Tree' was beautiful. As for Sandy MacNiell, wow! I think she may be the best Mad Margaret that I have seen in amateur productions. Her portrayal was so good that you could almost feel her fragility of mind. It almost felt wrong to laugh at the Basingstoke reference as it was her safety valve but she was so good and gave a wonderful portrayal of this unusual character and her solo was sung with such pathos.

The ghost scene was nicely done and I thought the use of projection screens ingenious. The supporting cast of Di Hughes, Jackie Bedford, Nigel Hughes, Gordon Brigg and the remaining ensemble made this a terrific evening's entertainment, which I thoroughly enjoyed thank you.

November Production – Arsenic and Old Lace

For the November production at The Phoenix I am proposing to direct the classic farce “Arsenic and Old Lace” by Joseph Kesselring. The play is often spoken of as a “black farce” or a “black comedy” – I tend to disagree since the themes of murder, madness and mayhem are dealt with in such a light-hearted manner it can only be seen as a farce pure and simple.

Abby and Martha Brewster are two delightful little old ladies renowned for their charitable works in the community. They occupy the family ancestral home in Brooklyn. The time is 1942 and America has just entered the war. Living alongside the two grey-haired spinster ladies is their brother Teddy – who believes he is actually Teddy Roosevelt.

Beneath this picture of urban peace and goodwill there lie many sinister undercurrents. The old ladies have a strange hobby – murdering indigent old men and burying them in the cellar – assisted by Teddy who constructs grave-sized locks for his Panama Canal. Then long-lost nephew Jonathan turns up. He happens to be a psychopathic killer on the run and accompanied by his personal plastic surgeon he purposes to set up business in the old family home.

Against this background Mortimer Brewster – the one ‘normal’ Brewster – well he is a theatre critic who hates the theatre – is wooing the girl next door – the minister’s daughter. When he discovers his aunts’ little secret he is beside himself and comedy mayhem ensues...

An extensive cast of characters offer opportunities for all levels of acting aspiration from the central parts:

Abby and Martha Brewster – the murderous little old ladies

Teddy Brewster – the mad brother

Mortimer Brewster – the ‘sane’ one

Jonathan Brewster – the psychopath

Dr Einstein – the drunken plastic surgeon

Elaine Harper – the girl next door and Mortimer’s fiancée

The Rev. Dr Harper - the Minister next door and Elaine’s father

Officers Brophy, Klein and O’Hara – police patrolmen and in the case of O’Hara playwright *manqué*

Mr Gibbs – a potential victim for the two sisters

Lieutenant Rooney – the head of the police precinct

Mr Witherspoon – Superintendent of the Happy Dale sanatorium

It may be possible to change the gender of some of these characters and also for some doubling. Of course with a play set in Brooklyn, American accents will be required but do not be put off. Experience in putting on an Australian and a Welsh background play has shown that ‘accent light’ is the best approach.

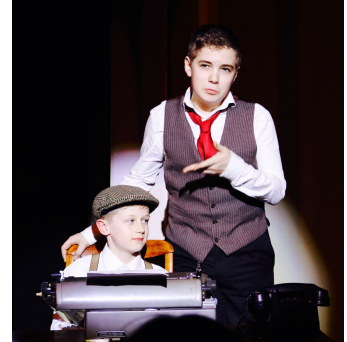
