The Youth Theatre sessions restarted for the autumn term on 16th September. They meet every Saturday morning in term time and are run by our facilitator from the Courtyard Theatre in Hereford, Kate Ross. There are three sessions each Saturday, Phoenix Kids, ages 4-7 years, from 9.30 to 10.15 am., (£41/term) and two groups of Phoenix Juniors, ages 8-14 years, from 10.30 am. to 12 noon and 12 noon to 1.30 pm. Kate directed a **Youth Theatre Summer Production** in July 2023. It was an adapted script of **Alice in Wonderland**. The show achieved 79% seat occupancy. Congratulations to Kate, her cast and crew.

We were nominated for the 2022 NODA awards with 'Relative Values' for Best Drama, 'Fantastic M. The cast features David Bradley, Judi Dench and Jennifer Saunders.




The Eight Mountains (12A)
